'Just a Trim Please' from your Seabridge Village Landscape Committee:

Have you ever imagined what the world would be like without trees? The benefits of trees extend beyond their beauty. Trees offer social, environmental, and economic benefits for years to come. And, let's be honest....taking the time to look skyward in a world framed by trees can help soothe your soul.

For those of us who live in Seabridge Village, we are fortunate to have many different species of trees as a component of our daily lives....in fact, Seabridge Village currently has approximately 2,000 trees planted on the grounds!!!! A 'heady' number to be sure. Of course, with such benefit comes responsibility, and the care and maintenance of our tree population is most critical.

To ensure the long term advantage of having a beautiful sky-scape, your Seabridge Village Landscape Committee has been working closely with our landscape vendor, Harvest Landscape, and their certified arborist, to develop a tree maintenance plan which will support the long term viability and aesthetics of our tree population.

With that in mind, you will note that in the month of December, Harvest will commence with the pruning and removal of specific trees. Unlike in prior years, the process has been amended to accommodate the maturity of the Seabridge Village landscape. Whereas pruning in the past has been done by species of tree, we will now prune trees on an as-needed basis. This allows for more efficient management of our tree population and also provides a means where cost can be better controlled.

You will also note that some trees will be removed from the community....typically those which are declining or pose a potential threat to infrastructure.

As a side note, when trees are removed from the community, there is a decision process to determine if a replacement tree would be planted, or utilize the space for other landscaping purposes.

Fear not, the long term landscape plan for Seabridge Village most assuredly encompasses the intelligent management of our tree population, and we will continuously search for ways to 'stand tall'.

Hazing Coyotes 101

Over the last month or so, single coyotes and a coyote pack have been sighted during both day and night in our community. The reported sightings have usually occurred in or near the grass area across from Tidepool Circle. These coyotes have not been aggressive, but they also have not displayed a fear of humans. One resident reported that a coyote began to approach her neighbor's small dog, while during another sighting, a resident reported that throwing a can did not result in scaring a coyote away.

Last year, a habituated pack demonstrating aggressive behavior was regularly present in our community. This was very concerning and frightening for many residents. Through education provided from the Huntington Beach Police Department and Fish and Wildlife, we learned that four areas **always** need to be addressed to make our community an undesirable place for coyotes. These areas are:

- 1. **Eliminating Assessible Trash**: Coyotes feed on rodents that are feeding on assessible trash.
- 2. Eliminating Hiding Places and Dens with Landscaping Revisions
- 3. **Keeping Dogs On-Leash**: When a dog is off-leash, coyotes consider it prey.
- 4. **Always Using Hazing Techniques**: Techniques residents can employ to make coyotes fearful of our neighborhood.

Addressing some of these areas proved successful in remedying the situation last year; however, an ongoing effort from all residents is needed to prevent a reoccurrence. While trash and landscaping are being addressed, we also need to work together to make our community an undesirable place for the coyotes to be. These bold coyotes should not be tolerated or enticed, but instead given the clear message that they are unwelcome in our neighborhood through hazing techniques. Residents *must* also keep their dogs on a leash at all times to help.

Methods of Hazing

- Stand tall, yell and wave your arms while approaching the coyote as demonstrated in this coyote hazing video.
- Noisemakers: Voice, whistles, air horns, bells, "shaker" cans full of marbles or pennies, pots, lid or pie pans banged together
- Projectiles: sticks, small rocks, cans, tennis balls or rubber balls
- Other: hoses, water guns with vinegar water, spray bottles with vinegar water, pepper spray or bear repellent.
- If a coyote has not been hazed before, they may not immediately run away when you yell at them. If this happens, you may need to walk towards the coyote and increase the intensity of your hazing.
- The coyote may run away, but then stop after a distance and look at you. It is important to continue to go after the coyote until they completely leave the area. You may need to use different tactics, such as noisemakers, stomping your feet, or spraying the coyote with a hose, to get them to leave.
- Never run away from a coyote!

Using a variety of different methods is **CRITICAL** so that coyotes don't get used to redundant or single stimulus devices, sounds, and actions

What You Can Do If You Sight a Coyote in Seabridge

- Refrain from taking pictures and haze instead.
- Make the coyote(s) feel unwelcome with hazing techniques.

- If you are on the Nextdoor app, please send an "Urgent Alert" as a courtesy to neighbors that there is coyote activity in the neighborhood with the location included. An "Urgent Alert" will immediately send a message to all residents using the app. Please make sure you haze before you send a message.
- If you receive an "Urgent Alert" and you are close by, look for the coyote(s) to haze it. Getting hazed by multiple people in different ways, will definitely make the coyote(s) think twice about spending time in our neighborhood.

How You Can Help

- ALWAYS haze a coyote when sighted.
- Ensure ALL TRASH is inside the trash bins and is NOT OVERFLOWING or OPEN. Lend a hand to neighbors who
 may have trouble opening trash lids and/or lifting trash into bins. Report any trash that is not located in a bin
 and any trash bins that are left open to Action Property with the location included and pictures if possible.
- Don't leave water, pet food or any other food outside.
- Pick-up, dispose of, and report to Action Property any fruit bearing trees that may have dropped fruit on the property.
- The coyotes have been sighted numerous times hiding in the bushes next to Tidepool Circle. These are located on the left side of the cul-de-sac when facing it from Seabridge Lane. When walking by, disrupt the bushes by hitting or shaking the bushes and making loud noises.

Coyotes are always going to pass through our beautiful neighborhood; however, we do not want habituated coyotes present on a regular basis that have the potential to turn aggressive. Through proper trash and landscaping management, keeping our dogs on-leash, and regular ongoing hazing, we can prevent this from happening. When we eliminate the food source (trash), eliminate the hiding places and dens (landscaping), eliminate dogs seen as "prey", and create fear WHENEVER encountering a human, the habituated coyotes will not become aggressive and will move on to more desirable places. If we work together as a community, we can accomplish this! Please help to keep our neighborhood and pets safe!

Gatehouse Post Commander Todd Says.....

Our new Visitor Management System, *DwellingLive*, has been active for a couple months now and is a huge improvement over the previously used system. Residents are enjoying benefits of the new system and its user-friendly phone app such as text notifications of arriving guests and instant verbal passcode change ability. Unfortunately, however, there are many Seabridge residents with incomplete information on record. The remedy for this is simple...complete a registration form (available at the guard gate) and turn it back in at the guard gate. If you are a landlord and not residing in your unit, please advise your tenants that they must obtain a registration form from the guard gate as they will not have received this information from Action Property Management.

Please note the importance of setting up your verbal passcode (super simple in Preferences in the *DwellingLive* phone app). Having an active verbal passcode allows the gate guard to confirm your identity when calling to add a guest to your list or entering Seabridge without your barcode sticker or ID. Please keep your verbal passcode private and do not share it with guests.
